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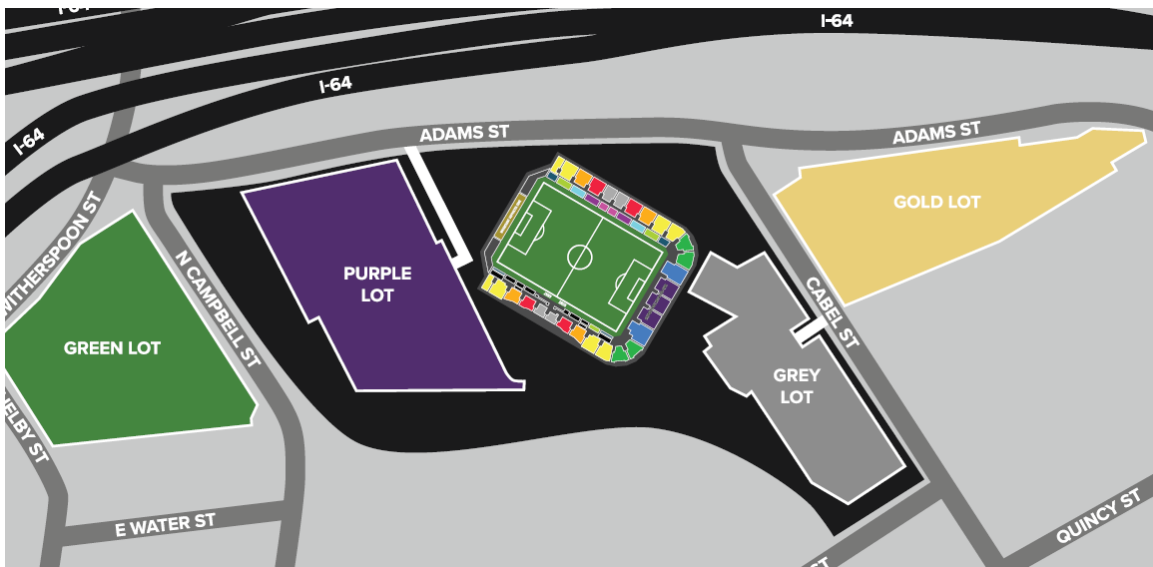

Leadership, Professional Development Hours/Certificates

School districts may award Professional Development hours for attendance at the Annual Statewide Career and Technical Education (CTE) Summer Program. The CTE Summer Program offers the opportunity for up to **15 Professional Development Hours**.

Attendees will receive a certificate of attendance/participation for the 2024 CTE Summer Program upon the completion of the CTE Summer Program evaluation in August to document attendance/participation. The evaluation instrument will be sent by e-mail by mid-August to each person who attended. Only those who registered and picked up their name badge to verify attendance will be e-mailed the evaluation form. If you did not complete the registration form personally, you must check with the Registration Desk to verify the e-mail address to which the evaluation instrument will be e-mailed. ONE DAY ATTENDEES must pick up their certificates at the end of the day of attendance. Daily certificates will not be e-mailed.

CONFERENCES do not require, and do not receive, an Effective Instructional Leadership Approval (EILA) number. KAR 704 KAR 3:325 (Sec. 3(2a)) allows districts to award up to 6 hours of EILA credit to instructional leaders each school year for educational conferences.

There are select sessions/meetings at the CTE Summer Program that are approved for EILA hours. **EILA certificates will be distributed to attendees at approved sessions.** Attendees must pickup EILA certificates at the session. EILA certificates will not be mailed following the conference.

Fees Waived for New CTE Learn Courses Authored by Kentucky Teachers Now Available

Three new **CTE Learn** courses authored by Kentucky teachers have been launched and are available at <https://ky.ctelearn.org>. To access the courses, register on the **CTE Learn** site and use the master key **MKKY24** to bypass payment.

Willis Holmes, a computer science teacher at Hopkins County ATC authored two courses: Introduction to Artificial Intelligence and Incorporating 3D Printing & Additive Manufacturing into CTE. For his effort, he earned two \$1,000 stipends from the Kentucky Association for Career and Technical Education (KACTE).

Jamie Scott, an engineering teacher at Hopkins County Schools, authored Strategies for Teaching Finance to CTE Students. For his effort, he earned a \$1,000 stipend from KACTE.

KACTE may award up to five \$1,000 stipends annually for authoring **CTE Learn** courses. The courses must be written with guidelines set by MaxKnowledge which is the host of the **CTE Learn** professional development portal through an agreement with the Association for Career and Technical Education (ACTE). Details on the KACTE **CTE Learn** stipend program and the application follow in this document. Also following are details on new **CTE Learn** courses authored by Kentucky teachers that are free to access by Kentucky teachers.

Career Ed Lounge Is Free Sharing Service in KY Portal

The Career Ed Lounge (<https://ky.ctelearn.org/lounge>), a free service provided through the Kentucky **CTE Learn** portal, provides peer-to-peer learning and sharing opportunities for CTE professionals. More than 220,000 career education professionals across the nation have joined the lounge to connect and collaborate with their peers. Lounge members can join any public community group to engage with their peers on topics of interest, or they can create their own group(s), public or private, and choose the engagement tools they want for their group(s) such as discussions, blogs, bookmarks and files.

New Modules Available Now on CTE Learn

CTE Learn continually seeks to update and upgrade the Kentucky On-Line Learning Portal with new courses, some of which are presented below.

EC133 — Introduction to Artificial Intelligence.

Explore the dynamic and evolving landscape of artificial intelligence (AI) with this course designed to cater to a range of learners from beginners to those with some prior knowledge. Starting with AI's history and core concepts, and distinguishing it from machine learning and deep learning, the course sets a solid foundation. Delve into practical AI applications such as natural language processing, computer vision, and robotics, and understand the ethical dimensions and biases in AI. The course advances into complex topics like generative adversarial networks and the interplay of AI with big data and quantum computing. Finally, envision AI's future influence in critical sectors like health care and finance, and you will be equipped with knowledge and skills to confidently navigate the future of AI.

EC132 — Incorporating 3D Printing & Additive Manufacturing into CTE

Explore the cutting-edge world of 3D printing and additive manufacturing in this comprehensive course, perfect for both beginners and experts. Spanning four detailed modules, you'll embark on a journey from the basics of 3D printing technologies and materials to the forefront of advanced applications. Learn about multi-material and bio-printing, dive into large-scale and industrial uses, and discover the transformative

impact of 3D printing in various sectors, including medical, education, and conservation. The course culminates with a look into the future integration of 3D printing with IoT, AI, and space exploration.

EC134 — Strategies for Teaching Finance to CTE Students

This course equips educators with innovative strategies for effectively teaching finance to career and technical education (CTE) students. Emphasizing hands-on learning, it covers fundamental financial concepts tailored to CTE curricula. Topics include budgeting, investment principles, and real-world applications of financial skills in diverse career paths.

Participants will explore interactive teaching methods, case studies, and industry-relevant scenarios to enhance student engagement and comprehension. Integrating practical examples and technology tools will enable educators to empower CTE students with essential financial knowledge, fostering financial literacy and readiness for their future careers.

These three courses are available for free to Kentucky teachers by using the code: **MKKY24**.

CTE Learn Introduces Unified Subscription System

CTE Learn now provides a unified subscription system for both individuals and institutions. Individual users get a subscription key that gives them unlimited access to all courses, and institutions get a single subscription key that they can share with all their users.

This unified system was created based on feedback received from CTE Learn purchasers and users. Purchasers were confused because they had to comprehend and consider two different purchase units (keys vs. users), and users were confused because of the different characteristics of enrollment and subscription keys. This change was made in consultation with ACTE leadership team to eliminate confusion, ease purchasing process, and simplify implementation and usage.

CTE Learn Offers Professional Development Credit From the Convenience of Your Personal Computer

CTE Learn's credit courses are endorsed by the University of Central Missouri (UCM), a regionally accredited public university. Participants have the opportunity to earn college credits for their completed **CTE Learn** courses. They can earn 1 Semester Credit Hour (SCH) for any block of 4 **CTE Learn** courses. In addition to eligibility to apply for both undergraduate and graduate college credit, completion of CTE Learn courses also provides participants with a professional development recognition badge and certificate of completion.

CTE Learn offers more than 180 self-paced online courses for CTE professionals. Each course provides 4 hours of continuing education credits. Participants can enroll in any course at any time to meet their individual learning needs.

CareerPrepped is a FREE online career success system that supports work-based learning programs with virtual activities, tools, and resources to help students build, prove, and showcase their workplace skills with authentic evidence.

CareerPrepped is FREE for individual educators to use with their classes or for schools, districts, consortiums, agencies, and other organizations in workforce development who want a centralized, organization-wide implementation.

- Help students earn competency badges.

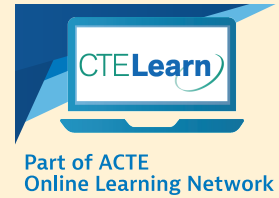

Over these many years, she has consistently and effectively provided timely information to students about navigating their transition from high school to college or career. She has provided college and career counseling to students and their parents, assisted them with applications for college admissions and jobs, guided them through scholarship applications, and conducted dozens of visits to colleges and universities.

In addition, Dr. Ruda has managed the College and Career Readiness course and its accompanying work-based learning experiences for more than 2,000

Annually, the number of students participating in this work-based learning program has grown from 97 in the 2007-2008 school year, to 259 in 2023-2024. CAREER AND TECHNICAL NEW TEACHER OF THE YEAR

Catherine Poole has been an agriculture teacher at Franklin-Simpson Middle School for the last four years. Coming in during COVID, she understood the importance of getting students involved. Ms. Poole piloted her FFA chapter in 2020. She empowers students by teaching them to apply theoretical knowledge in practical settings, fostering a deeper understanding of agricultural concepts. By engaging students in community service projects, such as Operation Christmas Child and donation drives for local animal shelters, she works to instill a sense of civic responsibility and encouraged students to make a positive impact beyond the classroom in ways they are passionate.

Ms. Poole has served as the Kentucky Middle School Agriculture Advisory Committee Chair, middle school agriculture professional development facilitator, pre-service teacher agriculture education workshop facilitator, mentor of pre-service teachers, and she led the pilot program for a new middle school agriculture curriculum.

She encourages her students to apply for scholarships and grants available to them through the FFA. By learning how to effectively write and apply for this funding now, these students can use their experience in high school to get scholarships to fund post-secondary education, and earn more FFA grants. Ms. Poole has had more than \$4,000 awarded to 7th and 8th grade students in the form of SAE grants, FFA jacket scholarships, and FFA Camp scholarships.

CLEARY CONSTRUCTION

KENTUCKY BUSINESS-EDUCATION PARTNERSHIP AWARD

Cleary Construction is an underground utility company in Tompkinsville, Kentucky. Currently, Cleary Construction supports career and technical education students in Monroe and Metcalfe Counties with the Cleary Academy, which is very similar to an internship for high school students. They also have an internship for college students, as well.

Students who participate in the Cleary Academy begin with thorough safety training and then have an opportunity to learn all aspects of the industry. 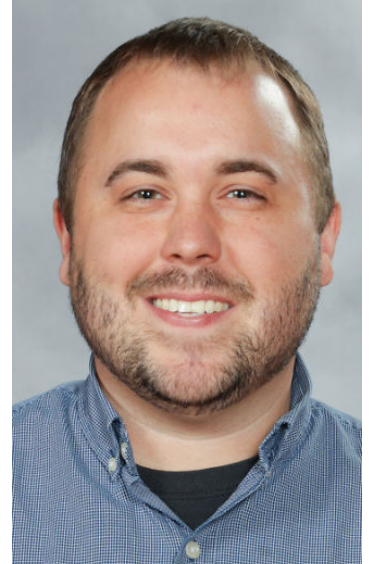
BRIAN WELCH

Two of the Kentucky Association for Career and Technical Education (KACTE) purposes embodied in the organization's bylaws are to foster excellence in Career and Technical Education (CTE) in Kentucky, and to advocate for Kentucky and national policy to benefit CTE. These efforts have led, in part, to increased awareness by the Kentucky General Assembly of CTE's vital contributions to the Commonwealth's economy and workforce development. **In 2022, the Association instituted KACTE's Award for Meritorious Service on Behalf of Career and Technical Education in Kentucky.**

This discretionary Award is determined by the KACTE Advocacy Committee Chair and the KACTE officers based on individual contributions to enhancing the quality, equity and access of CTE in the state. In recognition of his championing the value of CTE, KACTE bestows the 2024 award to:

- ★ **The Honorable Bobby McCool**, Representative from District 97, Kentucky House of Representatives.

In the 2024 Kentucky General Assembly session, **Rep. McCool**, a retired CTE teacher and administrator, introduced House Bill 499 in the House of Representatives. The legislation codified the funding distribution method for secondary CTE in the state to equalize access and equity in CTE instruction for every CTE student. The legislation passed with wide support in both houses of the Kentucky General Assembly and was signed into law by Gov. Andy Beshear. His legislative initiatives continued the evolution of CTE as a necessary and vibrant part of Kentucky's public education system.

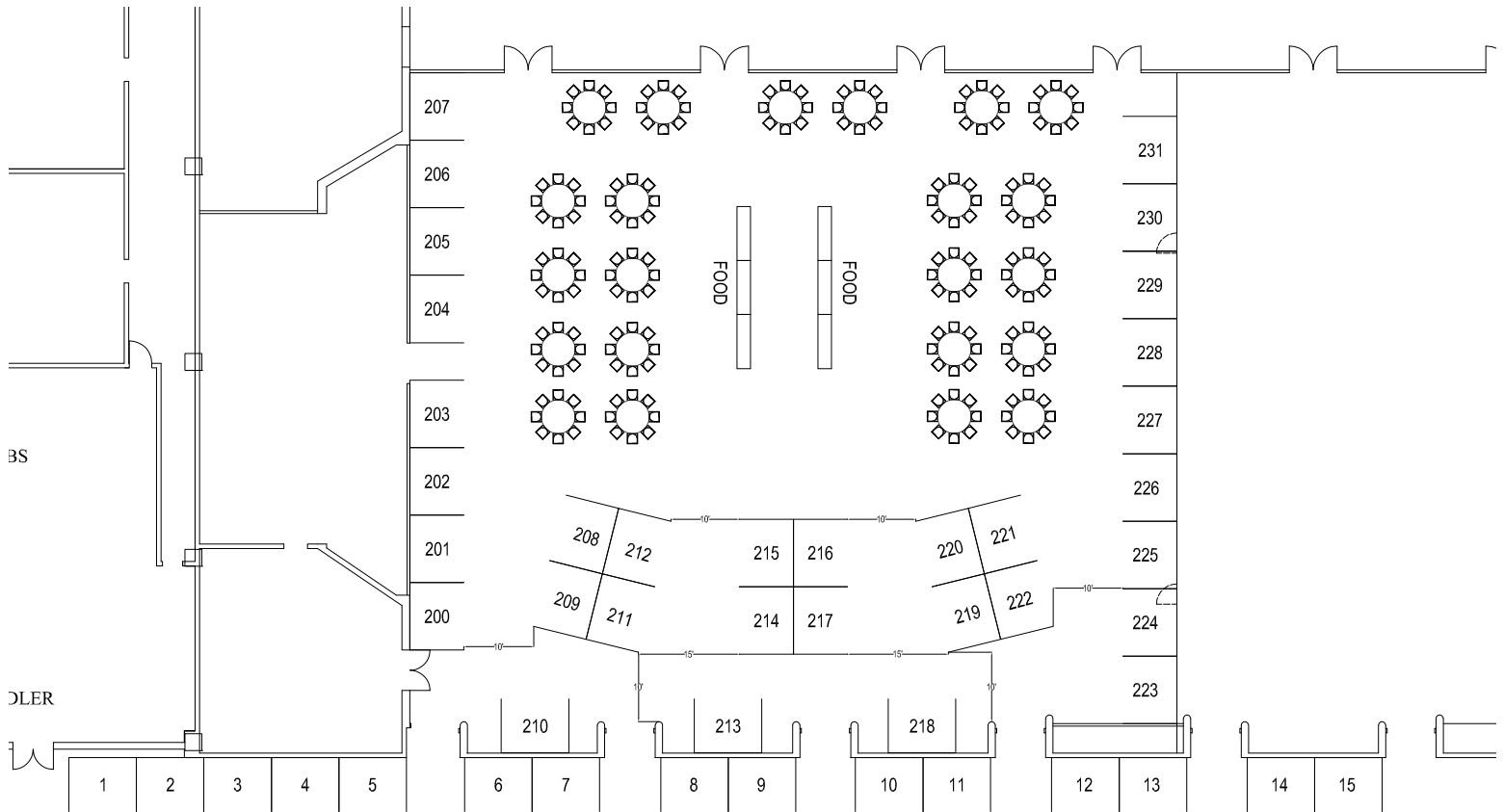

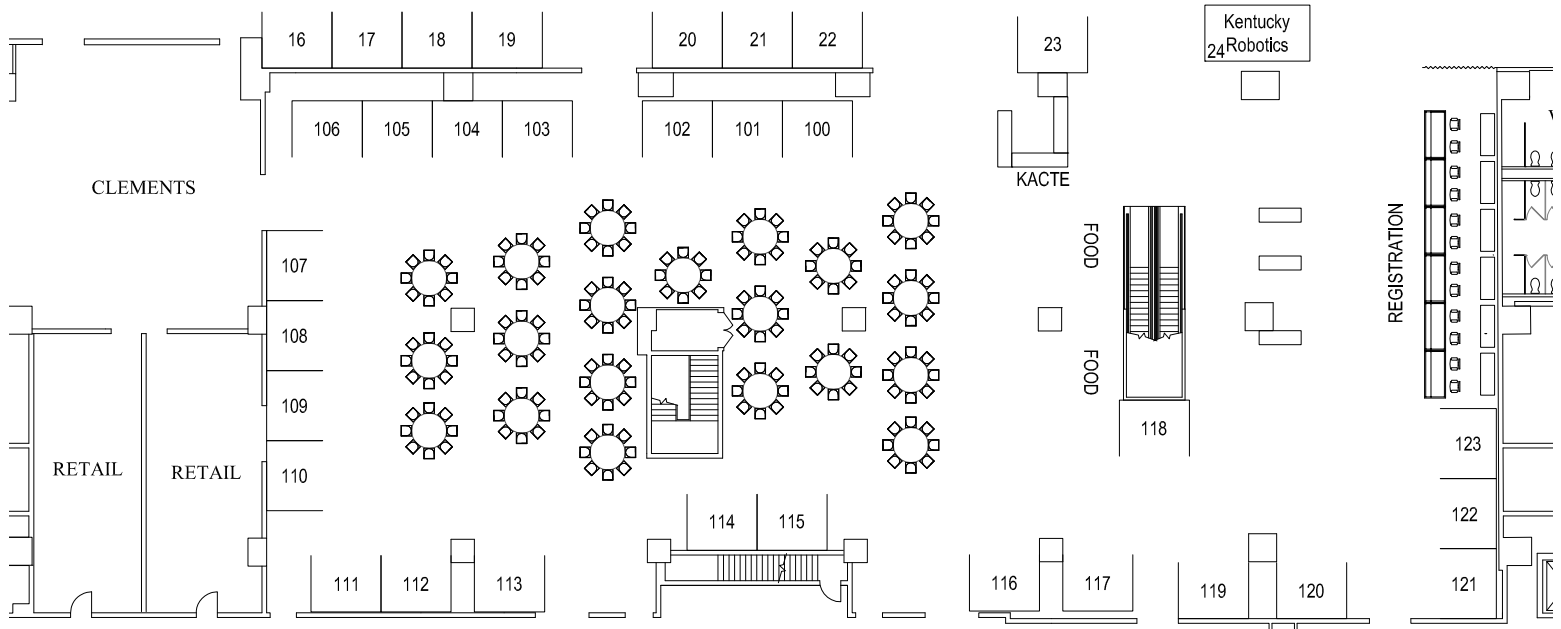
